- **MATH 1524** is the preferred MATH course for Asper students. Students who have completed one of MATH 1500 but not MATH 1524 are required to complete MATH 1300 for admission and degree requirements as one of the Non-Business Electives.
- To complete ICM 30 unique credit hours with Best 10 GPA 2.0 is required (does not include repeated/failed courses).
- 24 credit hours must be completed by end of April to apply for admission in September, with no grade lower than 'C' in each of the required courses. ICM students must still complete the 30 credit hours of completed (passed) courses by end of August to be admitted.

24 credit hours must be completed by end of August to apply for admission in January, with no grade lower than 'C' in each of the required courses. ICM students must still complete the 30 credit hours of completed (passed) courses by end of December to be admitted. Note: Admission to the Winter term is only if space is available and is open to Track 1 and Track 2 applicants only.

If a student has completed 24 to 60 credit hours of university work, the AGPA (Adjusted GPA) will be calculated using each grade earned at the post-secondary level – including repeated and Failed courses.

- Students should apply to the UM at the beginning of their second-to-last semester at ICM, prior to completing 30 unique credit hours. Please note, Students may receive conditional letter of offer once they complete 24 credit hours. It is upon the discretion of UM admissions.
- The Asper School of Business has two intakes per year, Fall (September) and Winter (January). Each
 intake has its own application deadline that students must apply by. These deadlines can be located on
 the <u>UM Admissions webpage</u>.
- Admission to the Asper School of Business is academically competitive.
- Students applying to Business must complete 24 credit hours, including all required courses (with a minimum C in each) by the end of April for Fall, and Summer for Winter intake, of the year that they are applying to the Asper School of Business via Advanced Entry to be eligible for admissions under Track 1. You can view the details in <u>UM Admission Requirements.</u>
- Winter Admission is available on space permitted basis.
- If you are starting your ICM program in Fall (September) or Winter (January), you must select ILS + 4
 required credit courses in your first term and 4 required credit courses in your second term to be eligible
 for the upcoming respective Fall or Winter intake. If you are starting your program in May, consult a
 Student Advisor for assistance in planning your progression into the faculty. You may want to consider
 transiting through Faculty of Arts.
