Students who need to complete courses during the Summer Session for the Fall intake and Fall Term for Winter intake to meet the minimum credit hour requirement will only be considered for admission on a space available basis after all other eligible students have been considered.
- If the number of eligible candidates exceeds the available spaces, an adjusted grade point average higher than the minimum may be required for admission.
