Your pathway to UM

ICM offers Foundation (UTP Stage I), as well as a wide range of International Year One (UTP Stage II) programs.

FOUNDATION (UTP STAGE I)

Foundation (UTP Stage I) is an eight-month program designed as a bridge between secondary school and university-level study. Successful completion of the program with the necessary grades assures you entry to ICM International Year One (UTP Stage II).

INTERNATIONAL YEAR ONE (UTP STAGE II)

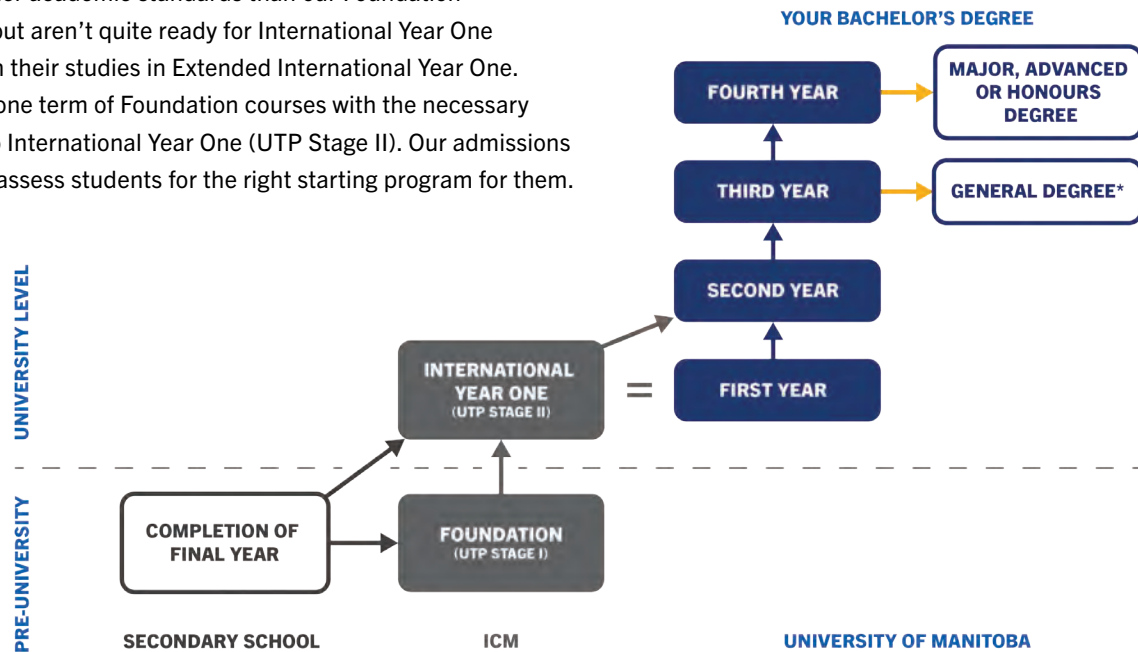
International Year One (UTP Stage II) is the equivalent of the first year of a UM bachelor's degree program.

Upon successful completion of International Year One (UTP Stage II), if you satisfy university admission requirements and deadlines and achieve the specified minimum GPA for admission, you'll be eligible to apply for transfer and progress to the second year of your UM degree. Admission to some degree programs will be on a competitive basis and subject to quotas. Meeting the minimum GPA does not guarantee admission.

Students who meet the International Year One (UTP Stage II) completion requirements but who do not meet the admissions requirements and competitive GPA of some degree programs will be eligible to apply to either the Faculty of Arts or the Faculty of Science, subject to UM's admissions regulations.

Students who meet higher academic standards than our Foundation (UTP Stage I) program but aren't quite ready for International Year One (UTP Stage II) can begin their studies in Extended International Year One. Students will complete one term of Foundation courses with the necessary grades before moving to International Year One (UTP Stage II). Our admissions team will automatically assess students for the right starting program for them.
